THEOLOGY PROPER

- 1. If God is immutable | unchanging (Num. 23:19; 1 Sam. 15:29), why does the Bible speak of Him changing his mind or repenting (Amos 7:3, 6; Jonah 3:9)?
- 2. How does God's immutability [He does not change] and human "freedom" interact [free will]? If humanity is free to choose whatever he wills, then in what way are the plans of God unchanging?
- Can what God knows beforehand [foreknowledge] change in "real time"?
- 4. If God is all-powerful and all-knowing and all-present, then why is there evil in the world? How does God's provision for evil run against His attributes of mercy and love? How did sin actual exist as to origin?
- 5. Is there a relationship between the fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 5:22,23) and the Attributes of God (Exod. 34:5-7)?

Exodus 34:5 The LORD descended in the cloud and stood there with him as he called upon the name of the LORD.

6 Then the LORD passed by in front of him and proclaimed, "The LORD, the LORD God, compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in lovingkindness and truth;

7 who keeps lovingkindness for thousands, who forgives iniquity, transgression and sin; yet He will by no means leave the guilty unpunished, visiting the iniquity of fathers on the children and on the grandchildren to the third and fourth generations."

Galatians 5:22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,

23 gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law.
